Purpose

To agree the format/wording of the GF foods prescribing policy and traffic light classification for GF substitute foods

Background

GF prescribing has been discussed previously at JAPC and their recommendation, results of public consultation, etc. were discussed at all 4 Derbyshire Governing Bodies in November/December. All four Governing Bodies agreed that GF foods should not be prescribed in Derbyshire noting GP professional obligations to meet clinical care needs for individual patients.

Summary

Attached is a draft Derbyshire position statement for consideration. The implementation will be supported in various ways (e.g. Information sent to patients, media statements, support from PALS, advice from dieticians for patients struggling to maintain a GF diet, FAQs sheet, etc.).

Financial implications

Stopping prescribing of gluten free products is expected to save over £700,000 per annum across Derbyshire.
