Pulmonary Rehabilitation Referrals to Impact+ (Community Respiratory Team – South of Derbyshire)

The Impact+ team have been receiving increasing numbers of patient referrals for pulmonary rehabilitation. Some of the patient referrals have not been appropriate for a number of reasons, and following discussion with the team, it was felt that we needed to put forward some suggestions where referral for pulmonary rehabilitation would not be appropriate at that time. Please consider the following suggestions prior to referring patients to the service:

Patients who are referred to pulmonary rehabilitation will be required to exercise to a high intensity and so please only refer patients who are suitable at the time of the assessment. The Impact+ team are receiving a lot of referrals for patients:

- Who have also been referred to Cardiology and therefore would not be considered until after the cardiology appointment.
- Patients who are high falls risk or who have had several recent falls and under the falls team would not be appropriate until their falls risk has reduced and mobility improved.
- Patients also need to be physically able to walk 10 meters or more in 20 seconds or less with or without a walking aid.
- Patients achieve the best outcomes when they are keen and motivated to attend, the team receives lots of referrals for patients who when asked, decline the programme or were unaware of the referral
