Electronic Referral Service (e-RS) roll-out / Paper Switch-Off Programme Update

From 1 October 2018, hospitals will no longer be paid for activity which results from referrals made other than through e-RS.

As part of the national implementation plan, providers are required to bring this date forward to get local processes in place before the national deadline.

DDLMC understand the pressure that secondary care are under to introduce these changes and are fully supportive of e-RS, but appreciate there may be circumstances where e-RS is either not possible, or appropriate; many of these instances are included on the e-RS exclusion lists which can be found here for Royal Derby Hospital (Chesterfield Royal Hospital online exclusion list pending).



Health Literacy Toolkit

43% of English working age adults do not have the health literacy skills to routinely understand health information (61% if this includes or involves numbers).

According to the Royal College of General Practitioners, health information is 'too complex' for more than 60% of working age adults to understand, which means that they are unable to effectively understand and use health information. Those with lower levels of health literacy are more likely to suffer from health inequalities that lead to the poorest health outcomes.

LMC Buying Group - Update on use of adjuvanted trivalent flu vaccines

The LMC Buying Group are aware that NHS England circulated a letter to GP practices about the use of adjuvanted trivalent flu vaccine for 2018-19 flu season on 22 December.

The letter stated that the advice from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) is that the use of the adjuvanted trivalent flu vaccine should be a priority for those aged 75 years and over.

The LMC Buying Group launched its vaccine offers for the 2018-19 season in October 2017 and discounts were negotiated with manufacturers of trivalent, quadrivalent and the new adjuvanted trivalent vaccines.

In light of NHS England's letter, Seqirus have extended their early bird discounts until the end of January. Details of the discounts and other terms are available by logging in and visiting the Flu Vaccines page of the website.

If you have already placed your order with one of our other suppliers and decide to amend your order to allow for the purchase of FLUAD as well, then please contact your existing supplier as soon as possible.
