News from NHSE: Extended Access webinars

Improving access to general practice: accelerating delivery to October 2018

The recently published [Refreshing NHS Plans for 2018/19](#) requires all CCGs to provide extended access to general practice to their whole population by 1 October 2018. This must include ensuring access is available during peak times of demand, including bank holidays and across the Easter, Christmas and New Year periods. NHS England is continuing its webinar series on general practice access to focus on accelerating delivery, looking at some of the key areas which CCGs will need to consider. The first webinar will take place on [6 March 2018 at 3.00pm](#) and will be repeated on [7 March 2018 at 1.00pm](#). As well as providing an overview from the national team, the webinars will include examples from existing extended access schemes and an opportunity to ask questions on a range of topics relating to implementation.

GPC Update - Winter indemnity scheme survey

The winter indemnity scheme is due to end on 2 April 2018. This scheme is designed to meet the costs of personal professional indemnity for any additional out of hours (OOH) work undertaken by GPs this winter to enable the freedom to work additional sessions without having to pay additional subscriptions to their medical defence organisation. GPC are aware that this will have a great impact on OOH and unscheduled services and in turn... increase pressures on general practice even further.

GPC have developed a short survey to gauge the scale of the impact of this scheme ending and we hope as many GPs who do OOH shifts as possible would be willing to complete it. This will assist GPC in our continuing communication with NHS England to help secure resources for this scheme. Please share the survey widely with your networks, with a completion date of 16 March.

GPC - GP appointments data audit update

NHS England has commissioned a repeat survey of each GP surgery in England in order to better understand waiting times in General Practice. The survey will run through March; every practice in England receiving a telephone call which should last no longer than three to four minutes, and will ask when the third next available routine appointment is. GPC advice is as follows:

- The staff member providing the data should tell the caller when the third next available routine appointment with a doctor is
- Appointments which can be booked into a locality hub are valid for the purposes of this survey, and the third next available routine appointment should be given
- If no such routine appointment exists due to the design of your appointment system (eg: Total Triage, On-The-Day, Nurse Triage etc) then inform the caller you are unable to answer the question, and explain the reason for this

Compliance with this survey is voluntary and practices should only participate if they are willing and able to do so.
