Things to consider if you want to become an Educational Supervisor:

- Are you in an existing GP or Foundation training practice? This will help us assess the amount
 of preparation that you will need to undertake.
- What CPD activities have you undertaken or plan to undertake to develop your skills as a trainer?
- Have you contacted your local GP Training Programme Director team? This will ensure they:
 - are aware of your intentions.
 - talk to you about your plans (their support for your application is essential and they will consider local need for new trainers); and
 - o invite you to trainers' meetings, add you to e-mail circulation lists and get you involved in the world of GP training*.
- Ensure that you have the minimum level of experience:
 - By the time that you are to have your first GP specialty trainee allocated you are required to have:
 - a minimum post CCT experience of two years in a non-GP training practice; or one year in a GP training practice
 - Been in your current practice for a minimum of six months.
- Ensure you have the full support of the wider practice to become a trainer/training practice.
- You are working in the practice for a minimum of four sessions a week in order to have enough contact with your trainees.
- There are possibilities related to you becoming a supervisor of Foundation trainees in GP.
- You have the time commitment and level of study required to satisfactorily complete the PGCME.
- * You should begin to attend trainers' meetings at least six months before you plan to do the New Trainers' Course.
