### GP training as an Associate Practice – a NEW way to get involved

New guidance is coming which requires trainees to spend 24 months in GP placements during the three-year programme. HEE are responding to this challenge with a recruitment drive to build up the number of practices that can host a trainee, and to increase the number of trainers across the region. *We have listened to the feedback and have developed a simpler model for new starters.*

## Clinical Supervisor training – the starting point

- The course is designed to provide familiarisation with the requirements to support and supervise GP Specialty and/or Foundation trainees.
- 1.5 days training to qualify as a GMC approved Clinical Supervisor.
- 3 hours per year of CPD to maintain your eligibility.
- Practice application for Associate Training is a straight-forward process involving a virtual meeting and a tour of the premises.
- Annual review with your nominated link trainers (an experienced Approved Trainer), plus support when needed.
- Regular trainers workshops and opportunities to network and share ideas with other training practices in the area.

## How does it work?

- Once approved as an Associate Practice, you'll be assigned a GP Registrar
- Trainees will be in the middle of their training – they will already know the ropes but not yet be focusing on their final exams.
- The practice will receive a trainer's grant for hosting the trainee.
- The trainee's salary will be paid in full by the Lead Employer.
- Payroll and HR processes are all covered by the Lead Employer too

## And when you're ready to take it to the next level...

- Sign up to become an Educational Supervisor
- You will support trainees on their whole journey through training.
- You will see them develop over the years.
- You will develop their skills and watch them grow.

## Educational Supervisor (full Trainer) Approval

- Attendance at a New Trainers' Course
- Course is split into 2 parts, each of 3 days, plus workshops and assignments.
- Completion and award of a Postgraduate Certificate of Medical Education.
- The practice approval process is formal but fully supported by the local Training Programme team.
- Regular ES payments for supporting trainees
- Annual CPD allowance
