Eligibility Criteria for GPs

To ensure we are awarding funding appropriately and adding value to Derbyshire general practice, we apply eligibility criteria and would encourage all applicants to complete our Equality and Diversity monitoring form.

All applicants must be:

- A current GP in permanent employed work within Derbyshire, or
- A locum GP working regularly within Derbyshire as confirmed by working via Derbyshire Flexible GP Bank or
- A recently retired GP (within 12 months) who was previously working in a substantive role in Derbyshire

In addition, the applicant* must:

- Hold a full registration and a licence to practise with the GMC and meets the requirements for remaining on the NHS England GP Performers
 - Not be subject to interim suspension under section 41A of the Medical Act 1983
- *unless a retired applicant

We invite you to complete one of our EOI forms to let us know how you can help us, what time commitment you are able to give and your special superhero skills that make you perfect for this role.

We are particularly keen to support applicants from underrepresented groups and / or those who have faced career challenges.
