- Attendance at an initial 2 day specialist "Teaching the Teachers in Primary Care" course
- 2 half days co-facilitating medical student teaching in a University environment
- An additional 3rd day to consolidate and re-enforce learning focusing on supervision skills
- Opportunities to become involved in more teaching and CV building activities to enhance your future career opportunities as a teacher
- Becoming part of a longitudinal mentoring programme that can enhance, not only your career but your peers, and the GPs of tomorrow.

Doctors who have attended the GP academy in the past have presented at national and regional conferences, participated in medical school admissions and interview panels, undertaken paid regional teaching roles and fellowships in teaching. They have also developed local networks of support to further develop their teaching skills and portfolio career.
